



## Emerging entrepreneurs invited to enter awards

ENTREPRENEURS from Business, the Arts or Social/Community are invited to enter the 2008 David Manley Emerging Entrepreneur Awards. "Given the global and local economic slow down - if not recession - that we are facing into over the next few years and our continuing loss of

competitive edge in the world market and, dare I say it, the 'mis-match' between our cost base and GDP growth rates - I believe we are going to be even more dependant on internally generated business activity," Mr. Kane said. "And the majority of that additional activity will, in the main, come from the SME sector. The seeds from which these SME firms emerge are the very same start up or emerging businesses which we in the David Manley Awards Committee are seeking to support.
